

WHAT TO BRING?

WARDROBE

- Everyday clothes
- Sportswear (pack plenty!)
- Indoor shoes and running shoes
- One or two sets of clothes that can get dirty
- Underwear
- Socks
- Thermal underwear and wool socks if you're often outside or get cold easily (optional)
- Sneakers and hiking shoes (preferably multiple pairs so you always have a dry pair)
- Swimwear
- Bath slippers, flip-flops, or Birkenstocks (a must for moving around the school)
- Bathrobe
- Cap, beanie, or hat
- Sunglasses, glasses, or contact lenses
- Fancy clothes for weekends, etc.
- Pajamas, sweatpants, or similar
- Rainwear and rubber boots
- Outerwear suitable for the weather (optional scarf and gloves)

FOR THE ROOM

- Bed linen + sheets (the school provides you with one set)
- Blanket
- Laundry basket, IKEA bag, or similar for your laundry
- Computer, phone, chargers, headphones, and an extension cord
- Notebook and writing tools
- Towels (at least two)
- Water bottles and optionally a thermos mug
- Tote bag or reusable shopping bag (for shopping or trips)
- Backpack (for trips)
- Sleeping bag + sleeping pad (optional)
- Pocket money for snacks
- Photo ID, health card (yellow or blue), and passport
- Pictures or posters for the walls
- Adhesive putty ("Blu Tack") to hang things on the wall
- Hangers for the closet (optional)
- Storage boxes or similar (for under the bed and above the closet) (optional)

TOILET BAG

- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Deodorant and perfume
- Shampoo, conditioner, and soaps for the bathroom (including hand soap)
- Shaving equipment
- Body lotion and other creams (including sunscreen)
- Hair products
- Makeup and makeup remover
- Nail clippers, nail file, and tweezers
- Hairbrush, comb, and hair ties
- Vitamins or medicine (e.g., painkillers)
- Small first aid items – e.g., plasters, disinfectant
- Lip balm
- Cotton swabs and cotton pads
- Earplugs and possibly a sleep mask
- Hairdryer, curling iron, and straightener

BONUS INFO, TIPS & TRICKS

- Small speaker if you want to listen to music in your room or in the shower
- Snacks for the first few days
- Little room decorations to make it cozy: e.g., string lights, plants, pillows
- Books, magazines, crosswords, sudoku, etc.
- Your favorite mug for use in the common lounge
- Needles and yarn for knitting or crocheting
- Guitar or other instrument you play
- Bicycle and rollerblades (if you have them) + helmet (optional)
- Doing laundry is very easy. You pay with an app, and the washing machines dose detergent automatically.
- Remember cozy clothes and sportswear, as that's what you'll mostly wear.
- Sheets and towels don't get washed that often, so pack extra.
